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The meeting of the Legislative Subcommittee of the Truckee Meadows Water Authority (TMWA) and Western Regional Water Commission (WRWC) at TMWA, 1355 Capital Blvd., Reno, Nevada in the Independence Conference Room. Member Vaughn Hartung called the meeting to order at 2:31 p.m.

**Upon motion duly made and seconded, and carried unanimously, the TMWA Subcommittee approved the agenda.**

4. APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES OF APRIL 24, 2015

**Upon motion duly made and seconded, and carried unanimously, the WRWC Subcommittee approved the minutes of April 24, 2015.**

5. APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES OF FEBRUARY 10, 2017

**Upon motion duly made and seconded, and carried unanimously by the members present, the TMWA Subcommittee approved the minutes of February 10, 2017.**

6. NOMINATION AND ELECTION OF CHAIR AND VICE-CHAIR OF THE LEGISLATIVE SUBCOMMITTEE OF THE WESTERN REGIONAL WATER COMMISSION

**Upon motion made and seconded, and carried by unanimous vote of the members present, the WRWC Subcommittee approved Member Duerr to be Chair and Member Abbott to be Vice Chair, of the WRWC Legislative Subcommittee.**

7. PRESENTATION OF STATUS REPORT ON LEGISLATION OF INTEREST TO TMWA AND POSSIBLE DIRECTION REGARDING TMWA'S POSITION ON LEGISLATION

Steve Walker, TMWA Lobbyist, and Michael Pagni, TMWA Legal Counsel, referred to the table of bills on legislation directly relevant to TMWA as introduced through March 2, 2017. Mr. Pagni and Mr. Walker provided a brief description of various bills TMWA is monitoring and discussed staff's recommendations for the TMWA legislative subcommittee to consider. After discussion with the committee, there were no further questions and all staff recommendations were accepted, with exception for changing the position on SB197 from watch to support based on Mr. Walker's recommendation.

Mr. Walker referred to AB8, collection of delinquent municipal utility charges, and that he discussed with staff on whether or not to pursue including TMWA on the bill.

Mark Foree, TMWA General Manager, said that he and staff are discussing TMWA's involvement and there is still time to pursue an amendment to include TMWA. Andy Gebhardt, TMWA Director of Operations and Water Quality, added that the current write-offs are very minimal.

Mr. Pagni clarified the bill only applies to cities and a potential amendment would be to include TMWA as a municipal utility so it can enjoy the benefits as well. He stated that the legislative subcommittee could authorize staff to pursue the amendment.

**Upon motion made and seconded, and carried by unanimous vote of the members, the TMWA Subcommittee approved staff's recommendations on all bills except to change the position on SB197 from watch to support.**

**Upon motion made and seconded, and carried by unanimous vote of the members, the TMWA Subcommittee authorized staff to pursue an**

**amendment to AB8 to include TMWA as a municipal utility in order to collect delinquent municipal utility charges.**

Mr. Pagni informed the subcommittee that there is a hearing on AB193 scheduled for Tuesday, March 7 at 1:30 in the Assembly Committee on Natural Resources, Agriculture and Mining. He stated that he, Mr. Foree and Mr. Walker will be there to testify in opposition of the bill. He informed the subcommittee that he, Mr. Foree, Mr. Walker and Member Brekhus have already held meetings with the sponsors of the bill and passed on the TMWA Board of Directors' comments and direction and on March 6th and 7th will be meeting with members of the Assembly Committee on Natural Resources, Agriculture and Mining regarding the bill.

**8. PRESENTATION OF STATUS REPORT ON LEGISLATION OF INTEREST TO WRWC AND POSSIBLE DIRECTION REGARDING WRWC'S POSITION ON LEGISLATION**

Chair Duerr inquired who the lobbyist for the WRWC was. John Rhodes, legal counsel for the WRWC, replied he and Jim Smitherman are both registered as lobbyists for the WRWC. They are not full time professional lobbyists, but are following all relevant bills, and are available to meet with legislators and provide testimony to Committees, as required.

Mr. Rhodes referred to the staff report on legislation of interest to the WRWC, as introduced through March 2, 2017. Mr. Rhodes reviewed the bills listed, and stated that staff recommendation on all bills and bill draft requests (BDRs) is *neutral/watch*.

Discussion followed regarding AB138, authorizing the collection of rainwater for certain uses, and possibly change position to *support* at a future time and to add bills: AB159, AB193, SB134, SB138, and SB231.

**Upon motion made and seconded, and carried by unanimous vote of the members, the WRWC Subcommittee approved staff's recommendations on all bills, except to delete AB11 and AB39, and to add bills AB159, AB193, SB134, SB138 and SB231.**

Mr. Walker suggested to add AB205 as well to their list to watch because it concerns the management of wastewater.

**Upon motion made and seconded, and carried by unanimous vote of the members, the WRWC Subcommittee approved adding AB205 as a watch to the list of bills being monitored.**

There were no committee comments.

There were no staff comments.

11. PUBLIC COMMENT

Juanita Cox thanked the TMWA Board of Directors for not supporting AB193, fluoridation of the water system.
